Liberty Submits v1.1 Specifications to OASIS

The Liberty Alliance Board, responsible for Liberty Alliance Specifications, has approved a motion to enable further development of the Liberty Alliance Version 1.1 Specifications under the auspices of the OASIS Security Services Technical Committee (SSTC). Since the specifications build on SAML 1.0, it is in the industry's best interests that the documents converge, and that any possible conflict with future versions of SAML be resolved.
