# Quick View Insider: How Do I Get Rid of Bars from a Building Block

This article is a recipe how to take unwanted key figures out of SAP-delivered building blocks for quick view.





Building blocks are the individual boxes shown in quick view and key figures are represented by the bars in the charts of the rows in the tables:



In the quick view configuration (transaction /n/SCF/MYSCFG) there are three folders that deal with building blocks and key figures:




The building block shows the key figures that are assigned to it in *Assign Key Figures to Blocks and Define Navigation.* 


If you are willing to risk a modification, you can simply delete the assignments of those key figures you don't want to see.

#### For a modification-free solution:

• Go to *Define Building Blocks for Quick View* and copy the building block in question into the customer name space (X\*, Y\*, Z\*):



• Then go to Assign Key Figures... and copy the assignments for only those key figures that you want to keep to your new building block:



In each copied assignment, replace the name of the building block with the one created above.

• Now replace the record containing the SAP-building block with an identical one containing your new building block in *Assign Building Block to Quick View* for all records that contain the building block:



- Copy the assignment record and replace the name of the building block
- Delete the original record
